

The Arabian Desert in the Middle East is one of the most hot environments on Earth, and it has the less amount of rainfall. But to the camel, it is home. The camel is one of the most strong animals in the world. Camels can go for many days with only a little food and water. When they do find water, they probably drink the most quick of any land animal. Adult camels can drink about 25 to 30 gallons (95–114 liters) in ten minutes. How to Pick a Great Book

Reading is a good way to have fun. Do you know how to choose a book to read?

Start With Your Interests

Choosing a book to read for fun isn't like reading for school (but you'll probably end up loving some of the books you read for school and sometimes want to read more titles by those authors). You can pick something that's all about your interests, maybe about ancient martial arts, computers, or fashion design. You name it!

What's Your "Type"?

Do you prefer fiction or nonfiction (or both)?

Fiction books like novels or short-story collections can take you to another world or help you imagine something beyond your own experience. There are the classics, fantasy or sci-fi, mystery novels, or ghost stories. Maybe historical fiction... Try a range of types of fiction and see what you prefer.

Nonfiction books tell you the who, what, when, and why of something. They tell stories using facts — but that doesn't mean they're dull. Nonfiction books can bring to life the eruption of Mount St. Helens in Washington or help you see inside a Chinese dynasty. Many of them read like novels from start to finish.

Read the "Blurbs"

The reviews and quotes on the back and inside covers of many books are called "blurbs." They give you an idea of what the book is about, but can also help you pick future books. If you find a book you really like, take a minute to read the quotes (if there are any). Do you have an ereader? You can download free samples (usually the first chapter) of ebooks that look interesting before you buy or borrow one.

Finally, you'll probably enjoy what you're reading a lot more if you find a quiet place and make time for the book. We all multitask, but reading is best enjoyed when you can concentrate and focus on it. You'll see that time does fly when you're reading something you love!
